





The Invention of Wings by Kidd, Sue Monk



A Man Called Ove by Backman, Fredrik


A feel-good story. This novel about the angry old man next door is a thoughtful exploration of the profound impact one life has on countless others.





Looking For Alaska by John Green



The Book of Ruth by Hamilton, Jane


