The Flower Chef by Carly Cylinder



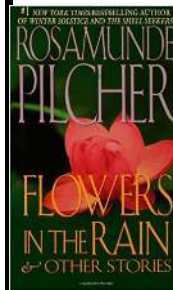

The Constant Gardener by John le Carré



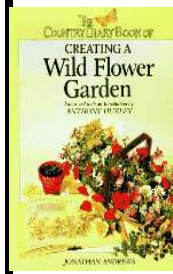

Flowers in the Rain: and Other Stories by Rosamunde Pilcher



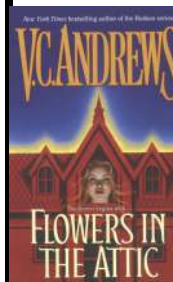

The Country Diary Book of Creating a Wild Flower Garden by Jonathan Andrews



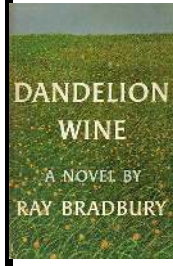

Flowers in the Attic by V.C. Andrews



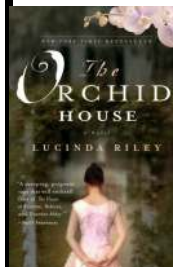
